Friendship Table-Tennis Competition Held by Beijing Personnel Service Corporation for Diplomatic Missions



READING DELIGHTS IN BDS: The Chinese Tunic Suit is a big variety of modern Chinese costumes. Since its birth in 1923, this tunic suit has all along been one of the most popular and best liked garments among Chinese people. So could you please introduce its origin?



Mr. Tai: Dr. Sun Yat-sen, the great Chinese democratic revolutionary, was the founder of this tunic suit. In 1919 when he lived in Shanghai, he took his old infantry uniform to the well-known Henry Tailor and asked the tailor to make some alterations on the uniform and turn it into a "casual wear". Then the tailor named

the suit after Dr. Sun Yat-sen. As Dr. Sun Yat-sen enjoyed high prestige both at home and abroad, this style of costume spread fast and wide. Soon it became

popular throughout the country. The Republican Constitution stipulated that only civil servants at and above certain levels had the capacity to wear such tunic suits when they were sworn in







READING DELIGHTS IN BDS: What are the special features of this tunic suit and what are the particular points for making this suit?

Mr. Tai: Generally the upper outer garment has four pockets each with one flap cover and one button. The pockets are respectively sewed on the left and right both up and down. The lower outer garment is a pair of Western-style trousers. In its designing, the trousers have combined both designing principles for Western suit and the designing philosophy for Chinese traditional costumes. Putting much emphasis on symmetry, the overall shaping of this suit is well balanced with shoulder pads and shaped waist. This suit looks steady, natural and poised. Many well-known figures such as Mao Zedong, Zhou Enlai and Deng Xiaoping chose to wear this kind of tunic suits on important occasions. The four pockets on both sides of the jacket are strictly symmetrical, for

they signify the four principles of the Chinese nation, i.e. propriety, righteousness, honesty and shamefulness. The three buttons at the cuffs stand for the Three People's Principles, i.e. Nationalism, Democracy and People's Livelihood. The five buttons at the middle of the front part of the jacket symbolize Dr. Sun Yat-sen's constitutional theory of five powers. The tunic suit has a turndown closed-style collar, which marks strict governing principles for the country. The suit has no slotting on the back of its lacket, which implies the peace and unification of the nation.

Headquarters in Geneva and wife of the former Chinese President Jiang Zemin.



So how the 'Envoy' Brand has managed to keep its characteristics and high quality?

Mr. Tai: Nowadays requirements for purely hand-made and customerordered outfits in China are extremely strict, and the number of mastertailors is getting fewer. The skills of BDS master tailors are already outstanding in the whole country. The difficulties lie in the timeconsuming and complicated process of custom-made hand work.

'Envoy' Brand garments, especially its Western suits are extremely particular about all the aspects including the fabrics, styles, even the auxiliary materials for the linens.

Handy Tips from Mr. Tai:

How to Verify and Appraise High Quality Cashmere Products:

Touch and Feel: If you feel cashmere, you will get the feel of sort of silk. So you will be comfortable with it without feeling any rough spot. Catch and Hold: It is highly elastic. You catch a handful of cashmere and you will have the feeling of elasticity of glutinous rice.

Release: Catch a handful of cashmere and then release it. The part of cashmere you have held will immediately resume its atness and smoothness. And it will not wrinkle easily.

Exposure to the light: Expose the cashmere product to be veri ed to strong light. If the product contains up-to-the-standard dense cashmere, its strains will be distinct and tidy. No light can easily go through the cashmere

Weigh in Hand: If it is too light, the cashmere content could be too little; if it is too heavy, it might be mixed with sheep's wool.

Burn: When you light cashmere f ber, it will smell of offensive burning odor. Moreover, the burning process is slow. The ashes left from burning will be in powder from, which can be smashed at a mere touch.

In a word, cashmere does not re ect light, nor does it prick your hand. It is light, smooth and elastic. You will not feel thick and heavy with it.

For instance, for the suit's inner linen, horse tail brown wool is needed as an auxiliary, because its resilient function can keep the suit more elastic, and the suit can better preserve its square and stately shaping. Usually the market price for a purely hand-made and custom-ordered western suit including both work and materials is no less than RMB 10,000 yuan. However, as an important BDS brand, 'Envoy' western suit merely costs around RMB 5,000 yuan for clients from various diplomatic missions.

(Mr. Tai in this interview report refers to Mr. Tai Yongshun, manager of the Garment Department of the Comprehensive Service Corporation for Diptomatic Missions.)





Everywhere you go in this country you can get the feel of the profound cultural foundation and heritage of Hungary. The legendary figure of Austro-Hungary Princess Sissi is deeply loved by the Hungarian people. People often come to her temporary palace at Godollo to listen to the accounts of the history from each of her portraits.

On March 15 every year recitation of Petofi's revolutionary poems still fills the Hungarian, who invented the Magic Cube.



However, you might not know that ball pens, the telephone exchange set and medical disinfectant were also created by the Hungarians. Moreover, the Hungarians first found out Vitamin C and the basic principles of computers. In 2002, the Hungarian writer Kertesz Yi Mulai won the Nobel literature prize with his works fate is uncertain which depicts the life of Jews at the Nazi concentration camps. He is one of the thirteen Hungarian Nobel Laureates. In per capita terms, Hungary is top on the list of the most Nobel Prize winning countries.





The Hungarian people are enthusiastic and straightforward, and the nation is characterized by honesty and simplicity. Originating in the east and following the footsteps of history, this nation migrated to the picturesque Carpathian Basin. In this place, the ancient oriental culture integrated with the European civilization into one, bringing forth the unique Hungarians. Dim traces of a nomadic nation could still be found in the costumes, ornaments, music pieces, dances and dietetic habits of the present Hungarians. When mentioning a date, Hungarians follow the order of the year, month and date, not the vice versa. When it comes to the order of a full name, the surname precedes one's given name and not the contrary. This unique custom is the only one of its kind among western countries, which clearly shows the Hungarian historical and cultural origins.

You will personally feel the time-honored wine making culture of Hungary so long as you go to the quiet and picturesque Tokaj town. The local wine Tokaj Asza won the royal title of 'king's Wine and Wine's King' from Peter the Great. Peter the Great once sent some professionals here to plant grapes in order to brew a tonic wine for his health building. It is said that Eger's red wine named 'Bikaver (Bull's Blood in English)' deterred the Ottoman troops who had to retreat without a



fighting in spite of its protracted siege of the city. I went to the Villany district in south Hungary every year to attend the grape picking activity. Wines produced here are thick in color and smell of mellow aroma. Many times they won gold medals in international competitions. My colleagues referred to Villany as "Wéi Le Ni", which means "for you" in English, and called Tokaj "Dōu KéYi", which means "either will do" in English. So in this way, "Wéi Le Ni" and "Dōu KéYi" became our popular toast language.

So, why Hungary which has only a population of 10 million can attract more than 40 million foreign tourists each year? I am sure you have found the answer now.

Introduction to Hungarian Wines

Hungarian wine's history dates back to 2000 years ago during the Roman period, when the Western Hungary was ruled by the Roman Empire and the Roman wine culture began to spread in this country. Since that time Hungarians have been growing grapes and making wine.

Located in the Basin of Central Europe, Hungary is surrounded by land on all sides and has a typical continental climate. With unique and diverse climate and soil, Hungary can brew a variety of quality wines. By the end of the fourteenth century, the country had established over 22 wine producing regions, which have remained unchanged till the present time. The wine that has gained fame for Hungary wine is Tokaj, a top-class rum, which has always been a favorite of European royal families. Once, French King Louis XIV praised it as 'the king of wines and the wine for the king'. In 2002 this wine region was listed as a 'world Cultural Heritage' by UNESCO, which makes it stand out from thousands of wine regions in the world.

Compared to other wine exporting countries, as to the wines of same quality, Hungary produces wines with significant price vantages; Moreover, the major wineries here still adhere to the traditional process to ensure superior grape quality, lower fruiting rate, and excellent value for money. This also makes Hungarian wines extremely competitive in the international market.




Vincze Béla • Arcanum Cabernet Fran 2008

Songtangzhai Museum


Tucked away in No. 3 Courtyard, Guozijian Street, Songtangzhai Museum was founded by Mr. Li Songtang (also known as Li Wei), a famous folk art collector. Since its opening in October 2001, this private Museum has gained the reputation as being 'the only most valuable museum founded by poking around the rubbles', with over a thousand of relics collections ranging from the Qing dynasty bricks and Hang tiles to stone, wooden and brick carvings,

folk architectural structures, assorted items, indoor furnishings and furniture to the Ming and Qing dynasties.

A number of pairs of gate piers displayed in the Museum are the most precious collections among over 400 gate piers collected by Mr. Li Songtang, including one pair once standing before the Prime



Minister's Residence during the Yuan Dynasty when Beijing was called Dadu. It was engraved with 2 pictures drawn by Zhao Mengfu, a famous calligrapher in the Yuan Dynasty. One picture depicts 'Mongolians Feeding Animals Water' while another depicting 'Mongolians Taming Animals'. This pair of gate piers is truly a 'national treasure' among all the gate piers existing nowadays. Another most important treasure of this museum is a stone lintel engraved with a picture depicting 'Emperor on an Inspection Tour' from the Qing Dynasty.



1 Beijing Diaoyutai: Landmark Ginkgo Street

The most beautiful and famous Ginkgo street should be the street in front of the Diaoyutai State Guesthouse. It is said that the trees are the earliest of its kind ever planted in Beijing. It is indeed a destination to enjoy Ginkgo view every fall in Beijing.









2 East Section of Sanlitun Fifth West Street: A tranquil Ginkgo Avenue in the Heart of the City

Tucked away in the heart of the embassy zone, although close to noisy East Ring Road, this is a truly serene place where you would get the first never-forgettable glimpse of those blazing ginkgo leaves when just turning around the corner....

3 Ditan Temple Park: Ancient and Unique Ginkgo Road

Upon entering this beautiful garden, head to the northern area straight away and you will find the breathtaking road lined up with Ginkgo trees. Close to the north of the park, the little alley connecting Qingniangou Road and Xiaohuangzhuang Road is also blessed with lush Ginkgo trees.





4 Badachu Park: A Ginkgo Attraction in An Ancient Temple

Most of Ginkgo trees in Badachu Park are located in the temples.

5 Hongluo Temple: Male and Female Ginkgo Trees from the Tang Dynasty

Beijing Hongluo Temple is the largest Buddhist temple in northern China, and there are 'three miraculous scenes' including the male and female Ginkoo trees.



6 Tanzhe Temple Imperial Ginkgo

Tanzhe Temple was built before the birth of the city of Beijing. Inside the temple, to the east of Pilu Hall there is one Ginkgo tree dating back to



the Tang Dynasty with a history of over 1,300 years. The prosperous crown reaches to over 30 meters in height, and the trunk is as thick as 9 meters. According to the legend, during the Qing Dynasty, each time when the Emperor changed, a young branch would grow out of the tree and after a long time would converge with old branch. So Qianlong Emperor granted the title of 'Imperial Tree' to this Ginkgo tree and also named another Ginkgo tree in the west planted during the Liao Dynasty 'Supporting the Emperor Tree'. In addition, the two Female and Male Ginkgo trees planted during the Ming Dynasty in the Imperial House courtyard along the east road of the temple glow with bumper fruits every fall.
