"Thanks! Thank you very much!"


"Not at all, this is simply what we should do."



Peru is a country with profound history, beautiful scenery and rich resources, and it is also a country with great diversifications. For many years, its exotic landscapes and customs, ancient cultural remains and special humanistic and cultural sights have all along remained a great attraction for me.

Peru's land forms could be divided into three parts from west to east: In the west, there is a narrow coast strip of deserts and cases extending from north to south, in the middle mountains and highlands go through from south to north; the eastern part boasts broad tropical rain forests. Owing to different geographic conditions, the three parts differ in climate, culture and produce.

More than ten years ago, through excavation in the Supe River valley on the middle coast of Peru, people found the ancient site of the Sacred City of Caral-Supe which was a city




5000 years ago. This is the oldest American civilization ever found till this date. People of Peru are proud of this discovery. It is said that its history of rise and fall is more or less the same time honored as the ancient civilizations of Egypt, China and India. However, this city disappeared mysteriously only after a period of several hundred years. So it has attracted the curiosities of both experts and great number of tourists. At the invitation of the local government, I visited there. The host arranged a large-scale real-scene demonstration, resurrecting the scenes of life and sacrifice-making for ancestors of the ancient people at the ancient times. Tourists hope to decipher the message



left by the ancient people through studying the pictures carved on the stones. When you come to the stone-laid circular square which is said to be used for assembling and sacrifice-making, you could not help marveling at the precision of the shapes of the stone architecture and also imagining how grand all these activities were. According to the historical records, the local rainfall at the ancient times was rich and









sufficient and both trees and grass were flourishing. Nevertheless, you can only see yellow sands all around now, and no grass or tree can be found within a radius of 50 square kilometers. You cannot but sigh with great feeling at the great vicissitudes of the history.

To go to Peru without going to Machu Picchu historical remains is just tantamount to coming to China without going to the Great Wall. This site located in the mountain area of central Peru was once the Inca Castle. In the 15th century in the heyday of Incan Culture, this place was under the rule of the Incan Empire. Even when the Spanish colonialists swept across the whole Inca Empire while conquering the new continent, they never reached this Castle which was isolated from the rest of the world. By early 20th century when

an archaeologist discovered it by accident, the castle had already long been deserted. Till this date, we still do not know whether the inhabitants there migrated and settled down elsewhere or simply became extinct. The Castle, built on top of the Machu Picchu Mountain, is imposingly impressive, echoing each other at a distance with the Waynapicchu Peak to its south. The Castle, all built with stones, is divided into different zones such as Residence Zone, Sacrifice Zone and Agricultural Zone. And built in between them are magnificent temples, solid arch towers, winding and steep paths and hidden ditches for sewage water discharge. The castle follows unified designing and forms its own system. The rock stone architecture of Machu Picchu is a great wonder. The stones there have different weights with bigger ones as heavy as several tons and smaller ones weighing up to dozens or hundreds of kilograms. The stones are in extremely irregular shapes, but they all catch and hold each other most tightly without any use of mortar. The Incan people built such an exquisite stone architecture in an age where no iron tools, no horse or carriage could be found. It is a real wonder!





In the east of Peru, there is the vast Amazon virgin forest. Its size makes up approximately two thirds of the total size of Peru's territory while the population there only comprises one tenth of the country's total. Having a bird's-eye view from the plane in the sky, one can see boundless thick forest with glittering rivers winding through and various green layers overlapping and integrating with each other, and all these scenes combined with the blue sky and white clouds merge into a huge and wonderful picture. When we got into the forest, we found the dense tree leaves obscuring the skyline and often blocking the sunshine. Pointing at a plant which was as tall as an adult and as thick as a bowl, the tourist guide told us that this kind of tree contains the ingredients for some specific medicine. Such wild plant can be found only at two places in the whole world. All of a sudden, the Chinese classic novel Romance of the Mirrored Flowers occurred to me and I felt as if we had become travelers like Tang Ao (the character in that novel) and his party who found all around them strange flowers and exotic animals on their first trip abroad. In some places, within the area of one hectare there are 283 tree varieties and 17 kinds of canes and vines, and even a single tree can be home to 43 ant species which are nearly the total number

of ant species in the Great Britain as a whole. Peru is one of the ten countries with the greatest diversities of resources in organisms, species and genes. Its varieties of potatoes, peppers and corns all top the world.

Peruvians have different skin colors and facial features. The descendents of the Indians and the Spanish make up the most part while black and yellow races also constitute certain proportion. The prolonged racial integration and coexisting in harmony and sharing of weal and woe have brought forth outstanding representatives from different races to all walks of life. A Peruvian scholar told me that people of different races coming from all corners of the world have all contributed to the economic and cultural development of Peru together with the aboriginals. Their joint efforts have brought about the present Peru and such integration has also become an asset and advantage for Peru's exchanges with the rest of the world.



Tips for Touring in Peru

Climate: For Lima and other coastal areas in Peru, summer lasts from October to April while winter lasts from May till September. Temperature difference is not big, with the winter temperature not lower than 10 degrees C and summer temperature not higher than 30 degrees C. The climate there is suitable for travelling all the year round. Lima, the capital of Peru, is known as a "city without rain".

Telecommunication: China's three frequency channel mobile phones can be used in Peru. For telephone calls to China from Peru, the five-star hotels there will charge around four US Dollars per minute. If you buy a telephone card sold by local telephone companies, the charge rate will be around one USD per minute. If you buy a local telephone card in the Chinese language, the charging rate will be approximately 0.4 USD per minute.

Hotels: Personal toilet articles such as tooth brush and slippers are not supplied by hotels. So please get these things prepared yourself. Upon arrival at the hotel, please immediately ask for a business card of the hotel for use in case of need.

Time Difference: 13 hours slower than Beijing Time in China.

Currency: One USD is equivalent to 3.1 New Sol (2009).

Specialty: Abstract jewelries, brooches and rings of the Incan age, home decoration articles, handicrafts made from gold, silver and copper, traditional hand-woven fabrics of the Indians, tapestry, rugs, cushions, garments, woolen sweaters and decorative articles in great varieties and made from hides and skins of llama, a specialty animal in high mountain areas of Peru and Bolivia, wallets and purses painted with Incan patterns, leather goods such as belts and handbags and handmade ethnic crafts and pottery, etc. All these are full of the Peruvian national characteristics. And oil paintings there are more affordable than that of China.

Tourist Sights: The capital city Lima, Lake Titicaca, the ancient city of Cusco, the deserted city of Machu Picchu and the unsolved puzzle of Nazca Lines.

Interview with H.E. Mr. Gonzalo Gutiérrez Reinel, Ambassador of Peru to P.R. China



The Diplomats': Mr. Ambassador, thank you very much for agreeing to the interview. Please briefly introduce the bilateral cooperation between our two countries in recent years, especially in cultural and trade exchanges. And what will the cooperation look like in the future?

Ambassador: Since 2011, China has become the biggest trading partner of Peru. In 2012, the level of trade between our two countries has reached a record, and the bilateral trade rose to more than 15 billion U.S dollars. That is a significant change in the traditional trend of trade in Peru. Now, China is our main trading partner. In addition, the investment between China and Peru is also very significant. We feel that it is an excellent way to reinforce bilateral relations.

In the future, we would like to promote our new and nontraditional products, for example, Quinoa, through activities like the gastronomic festival we are having these days in Beijing. We would like to export Quinoa to the Chinese market. The festival is a great possibility for Chinese people to get interested in Quinoa. Other products like Paprika and avocados would have a potential market in China as well. Now Peru is one of the greatest exporters of grapes to China. Also, there are good opportunities for Chinese investments in the Peruvian market for manufactured products, fishmeal and any other products with high cost performance.

Indeed, we are encouraging Chinese traders to invest in Peru. They can get opportunities to know about Peruvian business, and the Peruvian Embassy is open to see them if they want to meet us. The commercial department is very willing to get in contact with anybody who wants to do business with Peruvian enterprises.

The Diplomats': Peru is one of the most important countries in South America. Do you have recommendations for specialties, tourist attractions or special local customs of Peru to our readers?

Ambassador: Now, one most popular webpage for tourists is Travel Advisory. Recently that page stated that the most attractive place for tourists in the World is Machu Picchu, in Peru. It is an ancient Inca city, which is in the middle of a tropical mountain forest at the top of a mountain with an extraordinarily beautiful setting. Peru is very diverse. It is not as big as China, but it has coastal areas, high mountains and beaches with a very nice weather. And then, there are hundreds of wonderful places you could go to visit: the mysterious Amazon jungle, the Tomb of the Lord of Sipan, the Nazca lines, the Andes Mountains, stunning ancient ruins etc.

Peru is a multi-ethnic and multicultural country. We have both native Peruvians and the immigrants. Some immigrants came from European nations such as Spain and Italy; others came from China, Japan, Africa and so on. So I would say that we have elements of different cultures.





The Diplomats': It has been one year and a half since Your Excellency took the position as the Ambassador of Peru to China. May I ask about your impression of Beijing?

Ambassador: I like Beijing very much. But there are only two things that I do not like: traffic and pollution. Nowadays, more and more pollution has become a problem. I can understand that it cannot be solved just over a month, and it is a long-term process. I believe that Chinese authorities are realizing this serious problem. The measure should be taken soon and I guess the Chinese government is focusing on it. One day this problem could be solved.

On the other hand, there are hundreds of things I like about Beijing. I think one wonderful place is 798 Art Zone, which is full of creative young artists. I also like traditional places in Beijing, such as the Forbidden City. Besides, I like the Capital Museum as well. I think it is one of the most beautiful museums I have ever seen. It is not a big one but it is very impressive. The architecture design of Capital Museum is fabulous. I am also interested in Beijing's history. I just bought a book about Beijing's legations in the 19th Century. It is very interesting walking in Beijing with these photographs of the 19th Century in hand. You can see how Beijing looked like over a hundred years ago. How Beijing has been transformed during that time. When some foreigners come to Beijing for first time, they are amazed how modern Beijing is. Chinese people are creating a modern capital, but they must not forget to keep a traditional Beijing as well.

The Diplomats': BDS has long been dedicated to providing high quality services to diplomatic corps. Are you satisfied with our services? What improvements should we make? Are there any other services that you would suggest to be added?

Ambassador: I think BDS is very good for the diplomats who live in Beljing. The Peruvian Embassy in China enjoys the superb services of BDS for 40 years. And if you could provide more thoughtful services, such as Taxi call center service, distribution of duty-free product catalogues, travel agency service for the diplomats and so on, it would be easier and more convenient for us living in Beljing.

A Bite of Peru







The rich food chains resulted from the diversities of Peruvian ecological environments and climates plus the hundreds of years of integration of various cuisines of the native Indians, the erstwhile Spanish colonialists and immigrants from all over the world have brought about the gorgeous Peruvian food. The American New York Times once commented: "The Peruvian cuisine is one of the most excellent cuisines in the world." In 2006, at the Madrid International Gourmet Summit which is the most important gastronomic forum in Spain, Lima was cited as "the Culinary Capital of the American Continent."

In July 2013, the Peruvian Gastronomic Festival was launched grandly in Beijing. From July 25 to August 4, Francisco Tsui Chong&Luis Angel Lofuk Jo, the two top chefs coming from Lima will lead Chinese and foreign guests through a marvelous Peruvian culinary experience at the Westin Hotel on Beijing's Financial Street.

Dishes Recommended by Famous Chefs from Lima

Appetiser-Papa a la Huancaina

This dish is a typical Peruvian vegetarian dish, dating back to the Inca Empire. Its main ingredients include pepper sauce, yellow potatoes and Huacatay (a highly fragrant herb, also known as "black mint"). Other ingredients include roasted peanuts, fried onions and tomatoes, cream or condensed milk, mashed biscuits or dried bread and salt, sometimes, lettuce, boiled eggs and gloves are also selected.





Cebiche

Cebiche means mixed fresh sea food served in raw, which is the favorite of Peruvians and also the most world- renowned Peruvian dish. It originated in the coastal inhabitants of the old Peru and has been highly popular in the coastal areas in the central and southern American continent.

The main ingredients are fresh sea food marinated in lemon juice, and green onions, salt, parsley and hot peppers can also be added. The dish can be taken together with sweet potatoes, corn or avocado-flavored side dishes. At the beginning, the raw fish had to be marinated in lemon juice for a week until the fish color turned completely white. Later, influenced by the Japanese immigrants having their raw fish, the raw fish of cebiche was eaten just having it marinated in lemon juice for minutes.

Chifa (Stir-fried Quinoa)

Quinoa is a variety of grains in the Andes area. Peruvians started to grow it as early as 5000 years ago. Quinoa used to be one of the staple foodstuffs in the Inca Age. It is highly nutritious with its protein content twice as much as that of other grains. It has been extremely beneficial to the various stages of human growth and development. The Technical Secretariat of the U.N. Food and Agriculture Organization designated the year of 2013 as "the International Quinoa Year".




The cooking method for quinoa is similar to the Chinese stir-fried rice. First warm up the cooking oil, then fry the broccolli, add washed and cleaned quinoa, add condiments such as cut garlic, ginger, bean sprouts, salt and pepper powder, and as the finish touch drop a little bit sesame oil and fry.



Pisco—The National Liquor of Peru

Pisco is a fine liquor of special taste. The liquor is distilled purely from fermented pure grape juice or fresh grape juice. No water, color or any other materials are added in the liquor. Nor it needs to be stored in a wooden barrel.

Different types of Pisco boast different aromas such as strange but fantastic aromas from tropical fruits, raisins, fig or even fresh flowers. This is exactly the "exciting comforts" as mentioned by Picardo Plama in his works the Pen vian Traditions.

-Drive Yourself to Beidaihe

Beldaihe which has been dubbed "Beljing's Rear Garden" all along is a famous summer resort. Its beautiful scenery of mountains and water is exceptional in the whole world. HOW TO GO

Distance and Route: The Beldaihe sea resort is located in the west of the central part of Qinhuangdao city of HebelProvince. Holiday makers who wish to drive themselves there may exit from the Sitang Flyover on the Eastern 4th Ring Road to come onto the Beijing-Shenyang Express Way, just drive on for a distance of 253 kilometers to the Beidaihe Exit. Then proceed from the exit to Beidaihe sea resort, covering a short distance of 12 kilometers. The total distance takes about two hours and a half's drive.

Toll Charge: After you get to the Beijing-Sheriyang Express Way from the Sitang Flyover on the Eastern 4TH Ring Road, you will drive to the first toil gate at Xianghe of Hebei Province. A toil charge of 20 yuan will be paid. From here you enter the Hebei section of the express way until you exit at Beidaine. At the exit a toil charge of 105 yuan will be collected. However, on the statutory festival and holidays, you are entitled to driving toil free.

Service Area: Basically at an interval of 40 to 50 kilometers all along the express way, there will be a service area available for travelers.

The restaurants around the market can be entrusted to cook these sea products for you (usually they charge just one to ten yuan for every half a kilo of sea food). The preparation process takes just minutes, and you just out yourself with all these delicacies.

Wonderful Integration of Chinese and Russian Appeals

There are altogether 719 villas in Beidaihe District, of which two thirds are European style buildings, including 39 building in traditional

Russian style. These century old villas, just like oldsters who have gone through the vicissitudes of history, tell people about the customs and appeals of the old times. By the roadside, you may find many Russian, Chinese and French styled restaurants. When the night falls, you may enjoy both Chinese and Russian art performances while having your meal. Saxophone playing, singing to the accompaniment of self guitarplaying and playing of the two-stringed Chinese folk musical instrument of Erhu, just name a few, will sometimes take you back to the history, and sometimes bring forth an exotic culture in front of you.

Houhai is a component part of Shichahai. As a matter of fact, hai refers to a huge man-made lake, take with limpid water reserved for the royal families of the old China. The surrounding area of houhai used to be a prosperous business district in the capital city of Dadu since the Yuan dynasty. Known as "the ancient sea port of Beijing", it was the terminal of the old network of moat water transport of grain to the capital. At that time there were restaurants, theatres, shops and workshops everywhere along the banks.







Houhai has been all along a renowned haunt for old-timer Beijingers to beat the summer heat and seek fun, and it has also been a tourist site. Beijing in the height of summer is unbearably hot and dry, but Houhai and its surroundings are much cooler. So people come here in their leisure time. They stroll around the lake under the willow trees, enjoying the gentle breeze, smelling the fragrance of flowers and hearing the singing of birds. All the pleasant moments in this area will make visitors feel completely relaxed and satisfied, which they can hardly obtain elsewhere.

The structural pattern of streets and alleys in the Houhai area took its initial shape in the Yuan dynasty. A great number of buildings here date back to many years in the past and they bear features of typical traditional architect. In Shichahai, there are 40 odd buildings and sites listed under the government protection as historic relics. Nestling under the dripping willow branches along both banks are mansions of princes and former residences of celebrities such as Mansions of the Gong Prince and Chun Prince, Former Residences of Soong Chingling and Guo Moruo. Commonplace homes and ordinary residents have imposing mansions of princes and celebrities as their neighbors and they stay in harmony with each other by the sides of the beautiful lake. Charms peculiar with Beijing have continued here for hundreds of years.



To do sightseeing in Houhai, one does not need to buy admission ticket, nor pay for the guide. So long as the visitors walk past the stone-laid banks and wander through the ancient-styled streets and alleys, they will definitely feel the profound culture and romantic charms. The great varieties of commodities at the shops of Yandai Oblique Alley are all full of Beijing flavors and tinged with Beijing's historical background. Beijing's traditional papercutting and its dazzling red color provide you with joys







and pleasures to your heart content. Home-used porcelain objects are of myriad colors and superior quality and sold at affordable prices. If you buy one for your home, you will rest assured that it will be both attractive and practical for use. If you are a Peking Opera fan, just drop into one of the Peking Opera objects shops, you will get everything you want: face masks, folding fans and costumes for different types of characters of the opera, it is really an amazing Peking Opera world for fans. It is also typical of the old-time Beijingers to have various snacks tucked deep in the lanes. Visitors can smell Beijing snacks such as cooked lamb trip,

wheaten cake boiled in meat broth and starchfilled sausages as you walk around. Old-time Beijing yogurt cools and moistures, and there is also tempting fermented mung bean milk. The century-old Kaorouji Restaurant (dubbed the Mongolian Barbecue) everyday attracts a



large number of diners with its authentic flavor. In case you are not yet used to Beijing's snacks, you don't need to worry at all, for one bar after another scattered along the banks can also cater you but with modern cuisines and wines and drinks. In a word, you can find the most perfect competition between and integration of both ancientness and modernity, and simplicity and passion around the clear water of Houhai.
